The Golden West College Foundation was organized in 1985 to solicit and manage gifts to benefit the college and its students. The Foundation is dedicated to supporting the College's mission of providing comprehensive academic opportunities to the community for lifelong learning.

A board of directors, who provides the leadership and direction for the organization's operation, manages the Foundation. The Foundation has grown steadily since 1985 with assets over \$1,900,000. This has been accomplished through donations of cash, bequests and grants from individuals and businesses. The Foundation has provided over \$2,200,000 in scholarships to Golden West College students. In addition to cash assets, the Foundation annually receives donated equipment and supplies that represent thousands of dollars in gifts in-kind.

The primary focus of the Foundation Board of Directors is working toward building support for college-wide needs. To nurture groups who have special interests in supporting Golden West College, the Foundation provides staff support and direction to three auxiliaries. Each auxiliary is managed by its own board and officers, requiring membership dues for operational expenses.



Report from the Foundation Chairman Bob Polentz

The Golden West Foundation again participated in the Scholarship and Awards Ceremony held in May by awarding scholarships to over 200 students. Since 1989, the Foundation has awarded over \$2,200,000 to deserving students. This has been extremely gratifying to the Foundation as the awarding of scholarships is a direct contributor to the enhancement of student success at Golden West College.



On Saturday, March 12, the Foundation held its eighth annual major successful fundraiser, the "Golden West College Gala." We are happy to report that we raised approximately \$142,000—a new record. The proceeds funded the Foundation's Wish List Program and the Foundation's Endowed Scholarships. We particularly want to thank Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A., Inc., Elmore Toyota and Union Bank of California as major sponsors and all the other underwriters who gave so generously to this event. We would like to extend our sincere thanks to the Gala Committee and its co-chairs Emilee Young and Charla Kabana as well as the community at large for continuing to support this very important event for the college. We look forward to continued success at our ninth Gala scheduled for March 25, 2006.

Our 14th Annual Courtyard of Honor Ceremony was celebrated last October. We had four Pillars of Support (\$25,000+) including the Brunilda "Bruni" L. Cronk Pillar, Rita Simonton Pillar, St. Joseph Hospital Pillar and the Waltmar Foundation Pillar. The donor wall was increased by 50 donor names, with five in the Golden Society (\$10,000+) category. Four outstanding GWC alumni were honored as Alumni Pillar of Achievement recipients. Since the inception of this awards program in 1991, 70 alumni have been honored.

As we look to 2006, we want to express our collective gratitude for the continued participation and leadership of the Foundation Board members whose continued commitment and participation is critical to the overall success of the Foundation's mission. The Foundation's objectives for 2006 include expanding Board membership and continuing a high level of participation from our members while seeking fresh ideas for new fund raising opportunities and expansion of existing programs.

This year has continued to be relatively challenging from an investment perspective with the market basically performing in a relatively narrow range. Under the guidance of the Investment Committee and its chairman, Doug Fabian, we have exercised a high degree of conservatism relative to our investments during the past year and will continue to exercise prudence in our efforts to increase the value of the portfolio. I would like to take the opportunity to thank Fabian Investment Resources and Spectrum Asset Management for their continued support and guidance on a volunteer basis.

In January it was a great pleasure that we welcomed Wes Bryan as Golden West College's new President to the Foundation membership. We look forward to many years working with Wes to develop new initiatives and continue existing successful programs.

In closing, I would like to personally thank the Foundation Board of Directors and those who have provided advice, counsel, professional guidance, financial support and personal time to the Board during the past year. It is not often that I have had the unique opportunity to work with such a dedicated group, and I look forward to the upcoming year in which we will work as a team towards the goal of enhancing student success at Golden West College.



New Student Center

Image is Everything



In Summer 2004, Golden West College's president formed an Image Committee to update the college identity. The committee was to assess the logo, school colors, slogan, college seal, school mascot and even the school name.

The committee was formed by an open invitation to the campus. All existing committees on campus were visited to invite members to join the Image Committee.

The goal was to have a new identity package completed by GWC's 40th Anniversary in September, 2006.

The Image Committee consists of 35 members including faculty, classified staff, students, managers, administrators, retirees, district employees and marketing professionals invited from the community.

After many designs and discussions, the committee agreed on a surfboard shape for its symbol/icon. The GWC design on the surfboard gives it a collegiate look.

During the same time period, Huntington Beach trademarked the name Surf City, USA. This gave further justification that the chosen surfboard shape was the best symbol for GWC to make a direct association to Surf City.

The new surfboard logo was presented to the committees on campus for further input. After all the presentations were finished, the new surfboard logo, with the updated sea green and sunny yellow colors, was approved September 21, 2005 by the campus-wide Planning & Budget Committee, and then by GWC President, Wes Bryan.

New College Seal

It was the consensus of the committee to design a new college seal. The seal is used where a formal look is desired: certificates, formal announcements and correspondence, resolutions, diplomas, etc. The final design comprises the same

typeface as the new logo, a laurel leaf — symbolizing achievement, the year GWC was founded, and GWC's first slogan — *Let Change Be The Tradition*. Its round shape symbolizes perfection.









Dodging Bullets with Technology

How do you train law enforcement for open fire scenarios without putting them in the danger of live open-fire? This question was answered with the purchase of a Simunition Conversion Kit, an example of an item that wouldn't otherwise be funded without the Wish List program.

Simunition is the technology that combines simulation with ammunition. This provides for the training of real life, close-range engagement of firearms.

"The beauty about this kind of training is that it is so realistic," states Ron Lowenberg, director of the Criminal Justice Training Center.

These training tools put officers in "live action," where you can potentially feel the sting of an assailant's bullet, have realistic recoil, and even smell the gun powder. This technology focuses on training to control adrenaline and assess the situation appropriately, enabling officers to react realistically.



This Wish List item will make it possible for the GWC Criminal Justice (CJTC) program to train over 300 SWAT and recruit officers per year. Offering two programs for regular duty officers and two programs for limited duty officers, the CJTC has the potential to disperse approximately 120 officers into the line of duty each year.

Nursing Program will Receive over \$7 Million

Golden West College is one of seven California community colleges awarded a \$7,132,743 grant from the California Community College Chancellor's Office. This grant is part of Governor Schwarzenegger's \$90 million initiative to solve the nursing shortage in the state of California. "The timing of this grant couldn't have been better," says Sally Morgan, director of the Nursing Dept. With over 1,200



students on waiting lists to enter the nursing programs in four Orange County community colleges, GWC has taken on the responsibility of offering a solution with the "Weekend Section." This program will increase enrollment by over 48 students per semester for five years, giving the opportunity to educate over 240 nurses and place them into the field.

GWC received over \$2 million from the initiative and was required to get at least a two to one match in order to be awarded the grant. Cash and in-kind commitments came from Hoag Hospital, St. Jude Medical Center, Moore Foundation, Fountain Valley Regional Hospital, Irvine Health Foundation, Dove Professional Apparel, Inc., Golden West College Foundation, and Golden West College.

"It gives us the opportunity to improve on an already state of the art nursing program," says Wes Bryan, GWC President.

GWC Ensures Student Success
Through the STAR Book Reserve
Program

The Golden West College
Foundation Board has taken
on the responsibility to
provide students with another
tool for their success. The Student
Textbook Assistance Reserve (STAR)
Program has been implemented in the
campus library to aid in the availability
for students to have an alternative way of
accessing class materials.

As textbook costs rise, the students are faced with the reality of determining their educational goal versus their budget. The reserve program is in place to ensure that students reach the goals they have set for themselves, as well as opens their eyes to campus-wide tools that are available for them to use.

The Foundation Board allocated \$20,000 to establish a book reserve program for students.

"I am so grateful to be able to offer these students such a great program," stated Cathy Siddiqui, GWC Librarian.

These funds have been used to purchase the top textbooks that will be used throughout the Fall and Spring semesters. The library has purchased 85 titles covering over 30 academic disciplines with 423 circulations which average 5 circulations per textbook.


Alumni Pillars of Achievement
