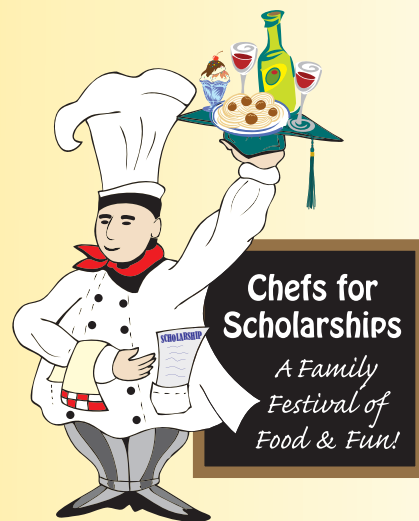

The Golden West College Foundation

The Golden West College Foundation was organized in 1985 to solicit and manage gifts to benefit the college and its students. The Foundation is dedicated to supporting the College's mission of providing comprehensive academic opportunities to the community for lifelong learning.

A board of directors, who provides the leadership and direction for the organization's operation, manages the Foundation. The Foundation has grown steadily since 1985 with assets over \$2,000,000. This has been accomplished through donations of cash, bequests and grants from individuals and businesses. The Foundation has provided \$3,026,524 in scholarships to Golden West College students. In addition to cash assets, the Foundation annually receives donated equipment and supplies that represent thousands of dollars in gifts-in-kind.

The primary focus of the Foundation Board of Directors is working toward building support for college-wide needs. To nurture groups who have special interests in supporting Golden West College, the Foundation provides staff support and direction to three auxiliaries. Each auxiliary is managed by its own board and officers, requiring membership dues for operational expenses.

Report from the Foundation Chairman Bob Polentz

The Golden West College Foundation again participated in the Scholarship and Awards Ceremony held in May by awarding scholarships to over 200 students. Since 1986, the Foundation has awarded over \$3,000,000 to deserving students. This has been extremely gratifying to the Foundation as the awarding of scholarships is a direct contributor to the enhancement of student success at Golden West College.

On Saturday March 24, the Foundation held its tenth annual major successful fundraiser, the "Golden West College Gala." This year the college was celebrating its 40th anniversary. We are happy to report that we raised approximately \$167,000—a new record. The proceeds funded the Foundation's Wish List Program for the campus and the Foundation's Endowed Scholarships. We particularly want to thank Toyota Motor Sales, U.S.A., Inc., Elmore Toyota, Union Bank of California, and Huntington Beach Hospital as major sponsors and all the other underwriters who gave so generously to this event. We would like to extend our sincere thanks to the Gala Committee and its co-chairs, Jerry Dominguez and Patricia Meredith, as well as the community at large for continuing to support this very important event for the college. We look forward to continued success at our eleventh Gala scheduled for April 19, 2008.

Our 16th Annual Courtyard of Honor Ceremony was celebrated in October. We had six Pillars of Support (+\$25,000) including the American Legion Auxiliary Unit #327 Pillar, The Boeing Company Pillar, The Glenda Blackburn and John Higgs Pillar, The Foundation for California Community Colleges Pillar, The Golden West College Bookstore Pillar, and The Chris and Tom Ohlendorf Pillar. The donor wall was increased by 143 donor names, with thirteen in the Golden Society (\$10,000+) category. Four outstanding GWC alumni were honored as Alumni Pillar of Achievement recipients. Since the inception of this awards program in 1991, seventy seven alumni have been honored.

As we look to 2008, we want to express our collective gratitude for the continued participation and leadership of the Foundation Board members whose continued commitment and participation is critical to the overall success of the Foundation's mission. The Foundation's objectives for 2008 include expanding Board membership and continuing a high level of participation from our members while seeking fresh ideas for new fundraising opportunities and expansion of existing programs.

This year has continued to be relatively challenging from an investment perspective with the market basically performing in a relatively narrow range. Last April the Foundation Board initiated a Request for Proposal for an asset management firm to manage the Foundation's portfolio. After a thorough interview process, HighMark Capital Management was awarded the contract. We look forward to working with this outstanding firm.

In closing, I would like to personally thank the Foundation Board of Directors and those who have provided advice, counsel, professional guidance, financial support and personal time to the Board during the past year. It is not often that I have had the unique opportunity to work with such a dedicated group, and I look forward to the upcoming year in which we will work as a team towards the goal of enhancing student success at Golden West College.

Helping Combat Veterans Pursue a Career in Law Enforcement

Ron Lowenberg, Director, GWC Criminal Justice Training Center, and Bob Mosley, Academies Coordinator, were determined to honor the sacrifices of our brave fighting men and women, and a vision was born. What if, when they return from overseas, a future can be offered to them? Collectively, with the help from people who care, a positive difference for our combat veterans and their families can be realized. The realization of this vision is the Returning Combat Veterans Scholarship Program (RCVSP).

Once combat veterans return to civilian status, and if they want to pursue a career in law enforcement, he or she can apply for a completely funded scholarship for \$4,300 (except for cost of living expenses). Their duty weapons, leather gear, and uniforms have already been donated to this account and over \$30,000 in equipment has been donated.

Presently, this scholarship program is a partnership between Golden West College, SureFire Corporation, Newport Beach Exchange Club, KRC Range Corp., American Legion Huntington Beach Post 133, and Leaders from the City of Huntington Beach.

Currently the program has five veterans who have completed a minimum of two tours of duty that will be attending the GWC police academy to get into law enforcement. We hope to have 30 in our next academy in June. All have families and will now be able to enter the program because of the scholarship program. All have served their country valiantly and now want to serve their community.

Message from Golden West College President, Wes Bryan

Every Fall semester, the college and the Foundation host our Courtyard of Honor Ceremony to jointly celebrate outstanding alumni and donors. In my welcome introduction, I made a statement I would like to share with you again: "Whenever a college president is asked what your favorite day is, you're supposed to say 'graduation.' But, today, (Courtyard of Honor) is my favorite day because we get to see what makes graduation possible. The world is forever changed because people like you support the institution; students like these take advantage of opportunities available to them, and teachers provide the foundation."



This event allowed us the opportunity to hear the stories of four very unique graduates and how their time at Golden West College made a difference in their lives and how they are paying that back in service to others. We also recognized and thanked those who have contributed time and resources to help build this Foundation and provide increasing opportunities for new students who might otherwise not be able to attend college. Yes, it was a very special day, made possible by the generosity of this Foundation.

Living in an affluent area, we sometimes forget how important these efforts are in making a significant difference in the lives of our students. Meeting graduates years later simply validates what we already know intuitively — that an education not only improves the quality of an individual life, it contributes to the community as a whole. We know that students who earn a vocational degree or certificate will see their wages jump from \$25,600 to \$47,571 in just three years. We also know they are more likely to be involved in community service, live healthier lives, and have greater job satisfaction. I am proud to be associated with a Foundation Board that understands the importance of educational opportunities, donates their time, and expends their energy to help students in need.

This year the Chronicle of Higher Education reported that Stanford University's endowment grew to \$14 billion in 2006, cementing its ranking for another year as the third-wealthiest university in the nation behind Harvard (\$29 billion) and Yale (\$18 billion). "The rich get richer," said Pat Callan, president of the National Center for Public Policy and Higher Education in San Jose. Callan doesn't fault the schools for their wealth, but says that having money comes with a special responsibility. "They're increasingly becoming institutions that serve primarily the highest-income strata of American society, and we've thought of them historically ... as avenues of social mobility. Clearly, this is a problem for all of American higher education."

I am happy that our donors realize and understand the importance of supporting two-year institutions and their students to help prepare them for transfer or learn entry level job skills. They know that if they can help them get a strong start, students are more likely to finish their degree or certification. Community colleges play a central role in workforce and transfer preparation.

I hope as you review this report you will consider involving yourself to a greater degree in the projects that our campus community sponsors. Without your support, the college could not begin to offer the scholarships and programs which provide our students with so many avenues to success. I am excited to be on this Board as we make plans together to ensure that the next 40 years will be as bright as the last.

Scholarships and Awards 2007

Since 1986, the Golden West College Foundation has processed \$3,069,000 for student scholarships. Each scholarship application involves a process of review by a scholarship committee who selects the recipients based upon individual scholarship criteria.

At the Scholarship & Awards Convocation held May 9, 2007, 262 scholarships were awarded to GWC students. In the 2006-07 academic year, a total of \$290,835 was awarded, representing a 29% increase in donations over 2005/06.

The Scholarship & Awards Convocation recognizes both the scholarship recipients and the donors who support them. The ceremony is held annually in the beautiful GWC Amphitheater. A reception following the ceremony provides a great opportunity for recipients to meet and thank their donors.

What's New at GWC

First Splash

In the summer of 2007, the sparkling new competition pool opened at GWC. The 25-yard, eight-lane pool is one of the projects completed with Measure C funds. Replacing a much outdated facility, the new pool is one of the fastest in the nation. Olympic-sized (52 meters by 25 yards), it has a moveable bulkhead, allowing for a variety of competition course layouts. Already this year, activities at the new pool include an exhibition game between the USA Women's Water Polo team and the silver medal winning team from Australia. The new facility will support the college's sports teams, aquatics classes, and high school and community groups. But the honor of "first splash" was given to Rita Simonton (pictured at right), long time supporter of GWC aquatics, and past Alumni Pillar recipient-turning just 90 years young this year!



A Groundbreaking Moment

On July 18, a ceremony was held to break ground for Golden West College's newest addition – a 25,000 square foot Health Sciences building. The three-story building will be home to the nursing program as well as the student health center, creating in-house internship opportunities for nursing students. "The building is sorely needed for the health sciences program," stated Golden West President Wes Bryan. "With the current shortage of nurses in California, this program is important to our students, our community and our state." The Golden West College Foundation will be considering naming opportunities in the near future. Students, faculty and staff at Golden West College can breathe easy these days thanks to the heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) upgrade project now well underway across campus. Funded through Measure C, the HVAC renovation is estimated to be completed in fall 2008 and includes the installation of a central plant, 20,000 lineal feet of piping, one mile of trenching and a cluster of portable classrooms appropriately named "The Village." The campus is taking advantage of having classrooms empty by upgrading electronics and internet connections. The renovated classrooms and offices will be a breath of fresh air!

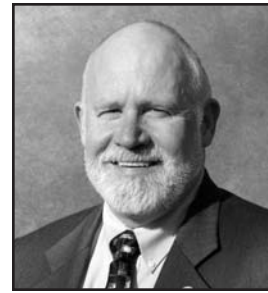

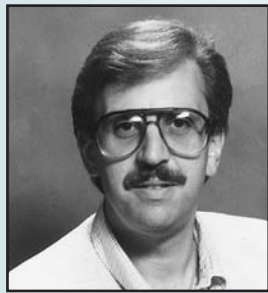

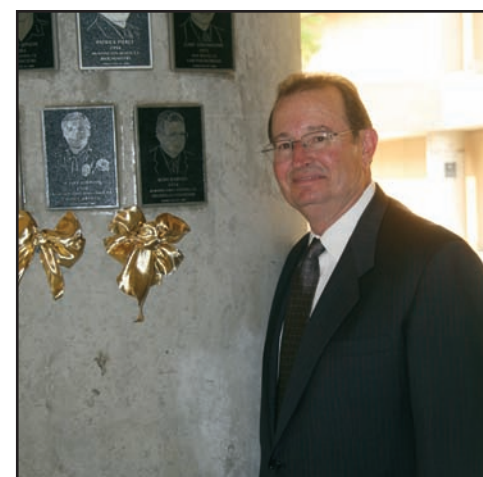
Alumni Pillars of Achievement

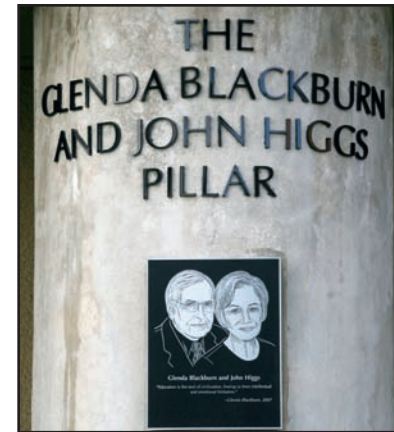

Elmore Toyota Donates a 2007 FJ Cruiser

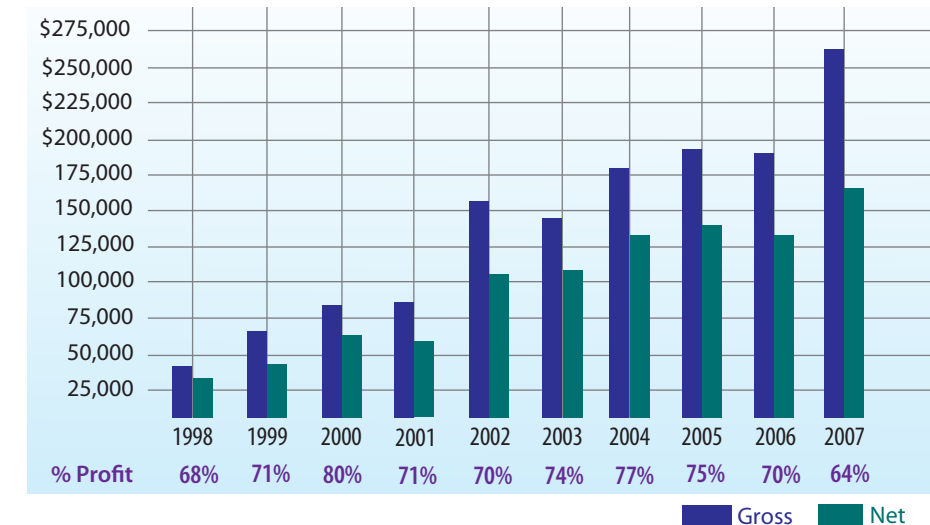

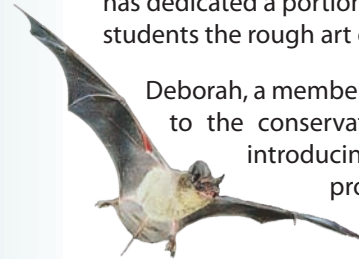

Foundation Wish List Supports Bat Conservation Studies

You don't need a secret phone or sky signal to find this bat protector! Just stop by the Golden West College biology department and meet Deborah Crough, part-time biology faculty and full-time high school science teacher. Deborah has dedicated a portion of her college curriculum to teaching students the rough art of field study.



Deborah, a member of the Western Bat Workers Group, an organization dedicated to the conservation and management of North American bat species, is introducing her students to the field study aspects of wildlife conservation programs. To enhance her student's practical experiences in the field, Deborah applied to the Foundation's Wish List program for two bat detectors. About the size of a television remote control, a bat detector does exactly what its name implies - detects bats in the wild by picking up their sonar output. Each individual species gives off a unique sonar, identified by the detector, allowing the field biologist to classify which species of bat is in that particular geographical location.

The Wish List Committee, a campus-wide group that reviews the Wish List applications, was amazed by Deborah's request. "This is probably the most exciting and interesting Wish List request we have received!" said Margie Bunten, Director of the Golden West College Foundation and Community Relations. "The Foundation Board is proud to support our students by providing such unique and vital academic opportunities," Bunten shared. Wish List grants are possible through funds raised at the Foundation's annual Gala, held each spring at the Hilton Waterfront Beach Resort in Huntington Beach.

For the Golden West College Biology 100 students who participate in the study, they will have an opportunity to present their findings to fellow bat researchers at the annual North American Symposia of Bat Research. Deborah's field studies curriculum and the detectors will become a permanent part of the biology department at Golden West College. We'll see what's in store for next year's students...maybe kryptonite studies!

Design Students Get Their Wish

When Golden West College DESIGN students received the new wood lathe awarded to the department by the Wish List Program, they went to work building a life-size model of *Star Wars'* R2-D2.

The model was on display at the *Design Student Show* in December. GWC's Design courses prepare students for all Design majors: Industrial; Automotive; Interior; and Fashion.

The Hens & Chickens Quilt Fellowship of Golden West College began in 1989 when a group of quilters did not want to disband after having taken a quilting class at Golden West College. Their name, Hens & Chickens, was taken from the name of a quilt block. Originally a group of 5, they have been 25 members strong and range in age from 7 years old to 75.

Each year, they make an opportunity quilt and donate the funds to GWC scholarships as well as contributions to the campus for such projects as theater renovations, ballet bars for the dance department, new library books, a Fine Arts Gallery security system, Science Museum animals and recently a brick entryway for the GWC California Native Plant Garden.

This year's quilt is a "Crazy Quilt" and carries the first embroidery stitches of the auxiliary's youngest member, 7-year old Samantha Marion. Crazy Quilts originated during the Victorian era when women used scraps of silks, lace and velvets along with decorative embroidery stitches to create these distinctive quilts. This quilt was started in March 2007 and was finished in October 2007. The members of Hens & Chickens cannot estimate just how many hours went into the making of this beautiful quilt, but they will say that every hour worked was a labor of love.



STAR Book Reserve Program Keeps Students Reading

For the third consecutive year, the Golden West College Foundation has allocated funds to the GWC Library for the purchase of textbooks under the STAR (Student Textbook Access Reserve Collection) Book Program. This program, which began in the 2004-2005 school year, gives students access to over 240 titles covering 45 academic departments. Last year, students checked out books from the STAR collection over 3,200 times, with the top title being Calculus: Single Variable. The STAR program has become a great success among students who wish to get a "jump start" on their studies and also to those students who cannot afford purchasing a full complement of textbooks. Faculty are also participating by donating their own textbooks to the collection. This year the Foundation allocated \$10,000 to the STAR program, allowing the library to add over 120 titles to the collection.
